Here, you'll find treasures like the Sansevero Chapel, with the famous Veiled Christ, and the Church of Gesù Nuovo, as well as artisan workshops, markets, and authentic trattorias.

The people of Spaccanapoli are the heart of the city: welcoming, lively, always ready to share a story or recommend a traditional dish. Tourists are pampered like honored guests, greeted with smiles and gestures of generosity. The local spots, from historic cafés to pizzerias, are filled with the aromas of coffee, sfogliatelle, and freshly baked pizza.

In the shops of Spaccanapoli, you can breathe the authenticity of Naples, a world made of craftsmanship, tradition, and passion. Here, among the narrow alleys and historic buildings, you'll find unique treasures: from Neapolitan nativity scenes, with their meticulously hand-painted figurines, to colorful ceramics, decorated with traditional motifs like the sun, the sea, and Vesuvius.
